

## How do we use this?

This map guides you on a storytelling journey through the landscape and nature reserve here at Worsbrough Mill. Use this map to guide you around the Country Park.

Begin your story at number 1 and follow the numbers around the park to map out your story. Each section has a few guidelines you may use to help you. It always helps to describe what you see and then the ideas for the story will come to you in exciting and unexpected ways. If you get stuck and don't know what's next, pass it on to a friend or family member to carry on the story.

As you go round, use the viewfinder enclosed and see if you can line up the landscape with the images here on the map.



### 5 Suddenly they approached a...

As you move over across the boardwalk, If you are lucky you might see a sparrowhawk. Step by step, there's no need to fear. What do you think could be living here?



### 6 For a moment...

Here is a chance to rest your feet. Take a break and stop, who might you meet? What can you see as you sit down? Are there any damselflies darting around?


### 7 Up high in an unusual tree...

Can you see any birds across the lake? A swan or gulls or a lonely drake? Add what you see to make up your tale, It's easy when you look, you simply can't fail.





### 3 Then they came across a...
